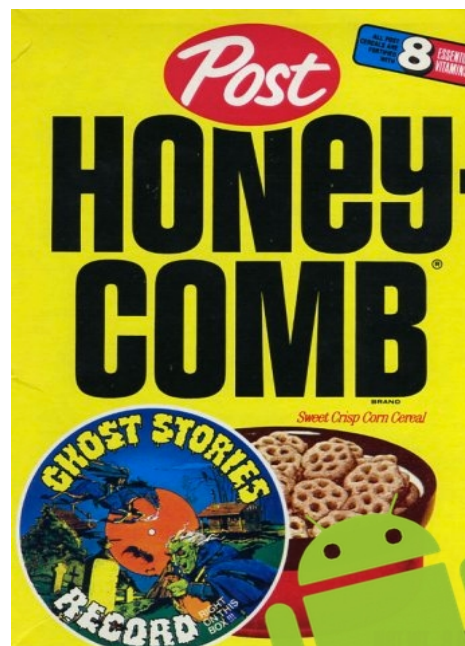
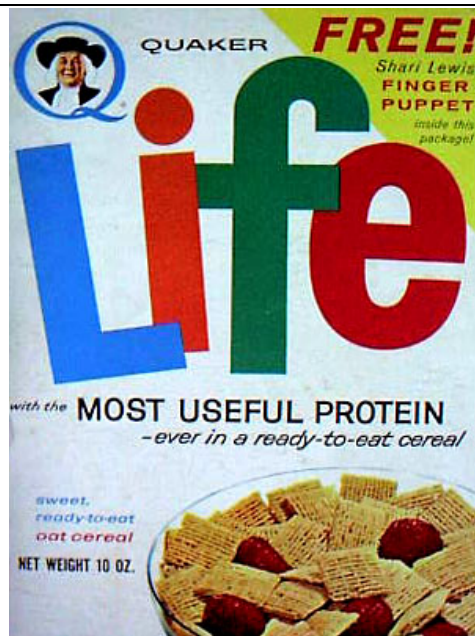
Listed are the "Top 10" cereals I enjoyed as a kid

#9 These were out of this world. Still occasionally found ‘here and there’ these were most popular 1965-1978.

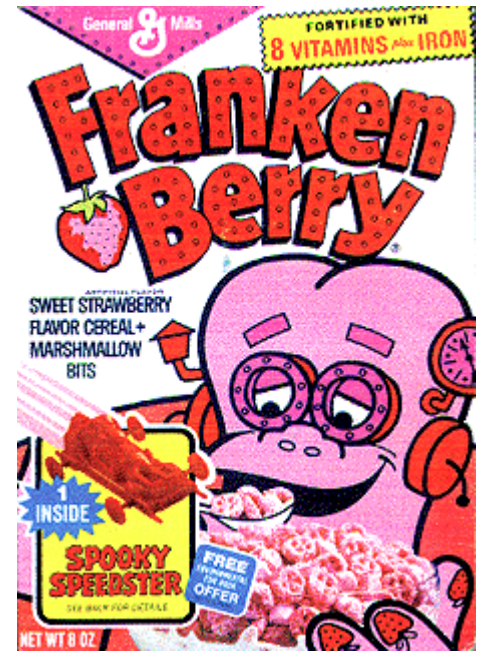
#8 A cowboy was the original mascot because the cereal was introduced in 1951 as a sponsor for “The Adventures of Wild Bill Hickok”

#6 Look – the original Domo! Introduced in 1965, these never got soft in milk! Working records used to be in the boxes, back in the day.

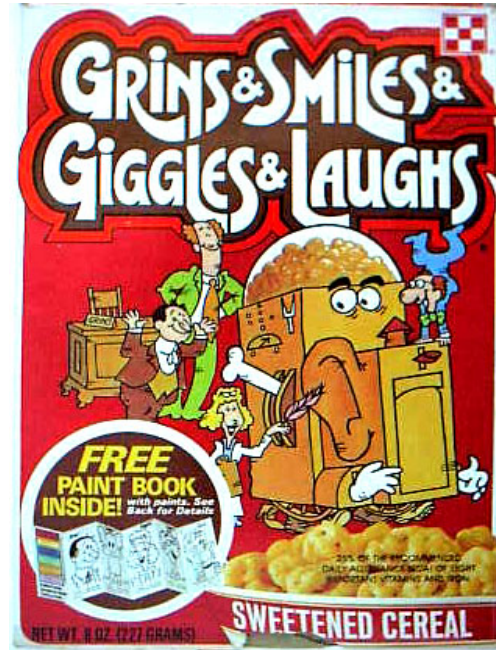
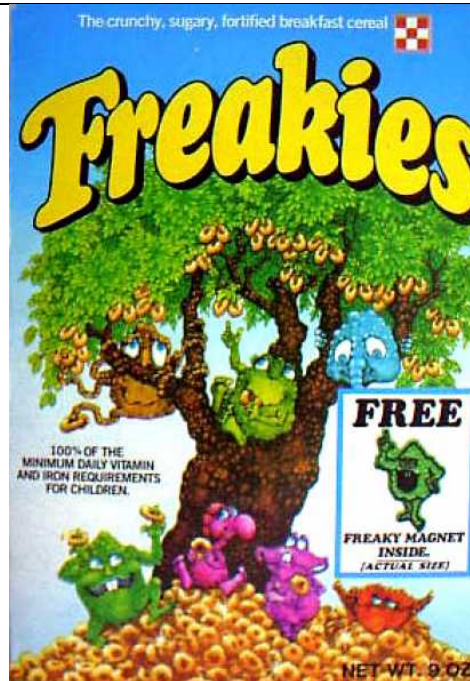
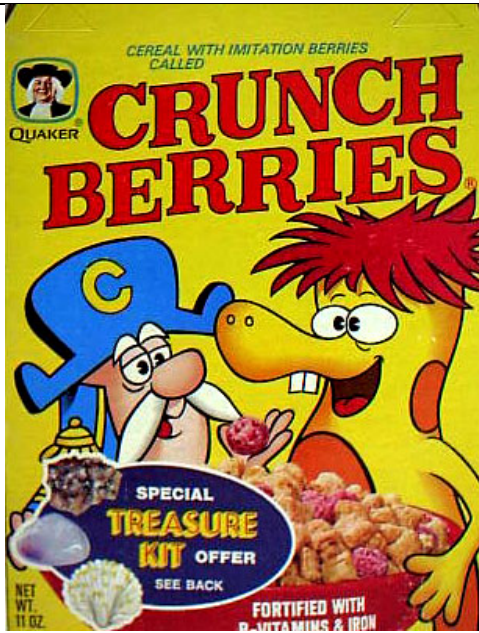
#5 Still one of my favorites. 1952. In the 1980’s many cereals dropped ‘Sugar’ from their title.
